Budgeting for a Kitchen Remodel

Budgets usually make people cringe and break out in a cold sweat. However, developing a budget is an important first step in remodeling a kitchen. A budget will ensure the project's success by:

- Keeping the project affordable and avoiding unnecessary financial strain.
- Differentiating between your needs and desires.
- Prioritizing key elements of the project and making appropriate tradeoffs. For example, a person who loves to cook may allocate more of the budget to appliances than a couple that eats out most nights.
- Creating a contingency amount for the changes or surprises which always occur.
- Making sure the budget does not run out before the work is completed.

Everyone would love a simple method to calculate a rough estimate for remodeling a kitchen. Unfortunately, each project is unique to the home and the owner's tastes. Costs can run from \$\$\$ per linear foot to \$\$\$\$\$ per linear foot depending on structural changes, cabinet type/finish, countertop material, and hardware/fixture selections.

The following factors need to be considered in developing a kitchen remodeling budget:

- Home Value – Most experts believe a kitchen remodeling project should cost 10% to 15% of a home's value. For example, the budget for a kitchen remodel in a \$250,000 house would be \$25,000 - \$37,500. Staying in these guidelines help ensure the investment is recovered when the house is sold.
- Longevity – If you plan to remain in the house for a long period time, more can be spent on the project. You will want to spend less if moving within 2-3 years.
- Floorplan – Significant changes to the layout of the kitchen, shifting the sink location, changing interior walls, or removing bulkheads will all increase cost.
- Wow Factor – Adding fancy trim and molding to impress visitors will drive the budget up. A simple update with minimal design elements and molding will reduce the cost.
- Appliances/Fixtures – Remember to include these items to avoid reusing dated appliances and fixtures in an updated kitchen. This can be a significant portion of the budget if higher end products are chosen.

Finally, it is important to share the project budget with your designer. Your design professional is a partner in the project and will recommend products and options to meet your budget and remodeling objectives.

Thanksgiving Trivia

- The Pilgrim leader, Governor William Bradford organized the first Thanksgiving feast in 1621 and invited the neighboring Wampanoag Indians.
- The first Thanksgiving celebration lasted 3 days.
- President George Washington issued the first national Thanksgiving Day Proclamations in 1789 and again in 1795.
- The state of New York officially made Thanksgiving Day an annual custom in 1817.
- Sarah Joseph Hale, a magazine editor, started the Thanksgiving campaign in 1827 and it was a result of her efforts that in 1863 Thanksgiving was observed as a day for national thanksgiving and prayer.
- Abraham Lincoln issued a Thanksgiving Proclamation in 1863 and officially set aside the last Thursday of November as the national day for Thanksgiving.
- Congress passed an official proclamation in 1941 declaring Thanksgiving will be observed as a legal holiday on the fourth Thursday of November every year.
